# 'Cello Concerto'

In the 2018/19 season, the MCO released its tenth CD to date, and the third on its MCO Records label. Entitled Cello Concerto, it features an MCO-commissioned concerto by the same name written by Michael Oesterle, a solo performance by cellist Ariel Barnes, and musical direction from conductor Anne Manson. Joined by the rest of the MCO's musicians, these artists render a genre-bending musical statement about the Industrial Revolution.

The performance heard on the album is the culmination of a 2017 Canadian tour with concert stops in Winnipeg and British Columbia. The MCO and Barnes delivered a very fine performance at their tour-opening concert in Winnipeg, and the ensuing tour allowed them to refine their performance further and better get to know one another musically. By their end-of-tour recording session they were 'combobulating' like a well-oiled machine to render Oesterle's piece, originally entitled The Iron Man, with all its nuances and virtuosic demands.


Over the next several months. Music Director Anne Manson traded notes about the recording with album producer Denise Ball, while the MCO administration prepped the CD production and design, working with esteemed Winnipeg artist Doug Smith for the cover's striking, industrialthemed illustration. The album was released in June 2019, and was praised as "phenomenally realized" by Fanfare in their (forthcoming) review. "Deft, imaginative and brilliantly orchestrated, there is an addictive aspect to this piece," writes Fanfare critic Colin Clarke.

Reviews of the CD continue to trickle in, while MCO Records endeavours to make the most of online and physical distribution opportunities as an independent label. Recently, MCO's recording projects received a high compliment in the form of a 2019 Western Canadian Music Award for Classical Ensemble of the Year. which it won thanks to the success of its 2017-released album Mirage? Concertos for Percussion featuring percussionist Dame Evelyn Glennie.

# MANITOBA CHAMBER ORCHESTRA CELEBRATES 23 YEARS IN THE BLACK

### THE MANITOBA CHAMBER ORCHESTRA continues its third

decade in the black. For 23 years in a row, the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra has maintained balanced budgets, and the 18/19 season was not just a stable season financially, but also a strong one artistically. This and other good news was proudly presented at its Annual General Meeting on October 23rd.

Attendance figures for our evening concert series at Westminster United Church remain steady, with a slight dip from 6150 in 17/18 to a respectable 5990. The MCO performed for over 7500 people through our outreach programs and matinees.

In September and June, the MCO 'Fiddlers on the Loose' travelled Northern Manitoba by van to deliver music programming, workshops, and performances. They engaged youth and communities in Churchill (flew in), Wabowden,

Grand Rapids, Gypsumville. Rorketon. Skownan. Pine Creek. Hollow Water, and Falcon Beach. In the winter, the Fiddlers performed for 200 people at Stony Mountain Penitentiary, Rockwood Institution. and the Women's Correctional Facility, while 'Fiddlers on the Loose in the Library' played to 220 people. The Artists in Healthcare program reached another 850.

2018/19 marked Measha Brueggergosman's conclusion of her quest-artist-in-residency at the MCO, with a moving, jazz-inflected performance in May of Strange Fruit, among other pieces. Six other concerts featured Canadian guest artists; especially popular were the MCO's concerts with Tafelmusik and Canzona. The MCO delighted in welcoming back such international luminaries as cellist Colin Carr and harpist Emmanuel Ceysson, whose connection with Winnipeg audiences continues to grow.

Our 18/19 season was an especially strong one in terms of the presentation of new Canadian music. There were premieres of MCO-commissioned concertos by Vivian Fung and Kevin Lau through the MCO's New Concerto Project, a reprise performance of Glenn Buhr's Three Pieces for Strings (commissioned by the CBC for the MCO in 1992), and performances of absorbing works by Christos Hatzis and Mathieu Lussier. Between their July tour (with pianist Simone Dinnerstein) and March tour, the MCO performed Vivian Fung's Concerto for Two Violins and String Orchestra, no fewer than seven times in venues across Québec. New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Ontario. Late in the season, the MCO released Cello Concerto. a five-track EP featuring a concerto by the same name written by Michael Oesterle and commissioned by the MCO, and a solo performance by cellist Ariel Barnes. So

far, the album has received high praise from *Fanfare* magazine.

Fundraising efforts contributed a great deal to overall revenue. Our Heartstrings Gala was among our most successful yet financially speaking. It earned over \$50,000, together with very strong results from our auctions and Funda-need, which brought in \$35,000. The VINYL VAULT's hot streak in recent years continues, with the fundraising arm earning over \$15,000 in 2018/19.

MCO's Endowment Fund, administered by The Winnipeg Foundation, received more donations from supporters and matching funds from The Winnipeg Foundation and the federal Endowment Incentives Program. It now sits at \$2.1M, plus a \$375,000 life insurance policy.

The MCO Board of Directors expressed satisfaction with the year's results, and has turned its focus to the promise of the current season.




